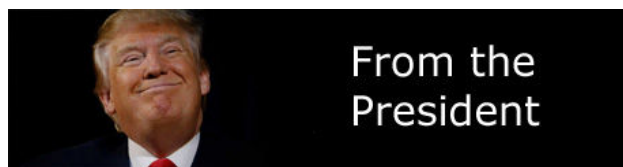

David Bloom, a member of the guild for many years died on Friday 10th February 2017 after an heroic battle with Motor Neurone Disease.

Although a qualified pastry cook David decided to change careers in 1985. He enrolled in a piano tuning course at the NSW Conservatorium of Music in Sydney and became qualified in early 1986. For the next few years he worked restoring and refurbishing pianos at Robert Rogerie's Hawthorn workshop and during this time gradually built up his piano tuning business. By the year 2010 the charm of "dinging away on pianos" as he put it, had waned, and he began making plans to wind back on the tuning side of the business and follow his real passion "piano restoration". David was diagnosed with the disease in October 2012 and by early 2013 he had to stop work. When he announced to his clients that he was ceasing work there was a huge and compassionate response. It seems that his work was quite highly regarded and he was warmly embraced by them. Many of the clients continued to keep contact with David as his health continued to decline and quite a few attended his funeral service. He was just 56 years old and died far too young.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO GAIN ARPT STATUS?

If you would like to have your skills and knowledge of piano technology recognised then consider joining the Piano Tuners and Technicians Guild, Victoria as a Provisional member. As a Provisional member you will be eligible to sit for the ARPT accreditation examinations in May and November of any year.

Membership of the Guild provides opportunities for piano technicians to gather and exchange information and to develop and refine their piano tuning and piano technology skills. Provision of piano related services to the community is very much a sole practice; the Guild provides a forum whereby issues within the industry can be readily discussed with your colleagues.

We are currently developing a self-assessment process based on the ARPT accreditation competencies. A Provisional member study group will be formed to assist all members wishing to gain accreditation based on the gaps identified through the self-assessment process. This assistance may take the form of mentoring or training within the technical sessions run throughout the year.
